



Linkage Development of Women Entrepreneur

Linking skilled women with the market and community is vital for economic and social progress. By creating robust networks and support systems, women can seamlessly integrate their skills into the marketplace, enhancing their visibility and access to opportunities. These connections enable women to showcase their talents and contribute effectively to the economy. Community-driven initiatives provide resources, mentorship, and platforms, fostering independence and confidence. This promotes gender equality, as skilled women become role models, inspiring future generations and driving societal development. In this regard, GBTI provides a platform by establishing a community display centre where skilled women showcase their products and get orders from suppliers and the community.



Environment & Natural Resource Management

The links between poverty and the environment are bidirectional: environmental degradation, whether occurring naturally or as a result of human interventions threatens the livelihoods of the rural poor and most of them depend directly on agriculture, livestock, poultry, horticulture, and orchard management to earn their living. Basic nutritional needs cannot be met when crop yields are reduced because of poor soil quality.

- Providing fruit and forest plants to make the environment clean and pleasant
- Providing vegetable seeds at the household level as well as imparting training in kitchen gardening to get home-grown organic vegetables
- Arrange training for "Female Livestock Farmers to take better care of their animals
- Provide poultry sets to rural women to meet their nutritional needs



Microfinancing and Community Healthcare and Bereavement Support

The rural microfinancing & enterprises development section's primary role is to ensure that microfinance funds are available to poor women households specifically through the given below products;

- Provision of interest-free loans to increase household income
- Provision of micro financing on sharia complaint "Tijarah"
- Providing micro health & bereavement support to community up to Rs.20,000/-



Livelihood Enhancement & Protection

Under this programme poorest of women (identified by using the poverty scorecard of which the community verifies the results) are provided grants or assets only for income generation activities on the basis of their micro-investment plan through;

- Poverty Targeting Fund (Asset Transfer)
- Community Investment Fund

Gender Mainstreaming

GBTI has identified gender as a cross-cutting theme. This requires that gender be integrated into the policy planning, programming, implementation, and evaluation of activities. GBTI acknowledges gender mainstreaming as a means of consciously raising the visibility and support of women's contributions to poverty alleviation.



Social Mobilisation

Social Mobilisation, the core of GBTI's philosophy is based on acknowledging that the community is the centre of all development activities and the focus is on women's community institutions.

Community Savings and Contribution

Under the Self-Help Initiative Program, women office bearers of community organizations play a vital role in strengthening collective development by mobilizing savings and contributions from each member. These savings are systematically pooled and deposited in a bank, creating a reliable financial resource to support multi-sectoral development projects such as education, health, livelihood, and infrastructure. Alongside this, member contributions are utilized to address urgent needs and emergency activities, ensuring timely support for the community. This practice not only promotes financial discipline and ownership among members but also fosters resilience, unity, and sustainable community-led development.



Education Promotion for girls

Increasing access to education by supplementing the government efforts and participating in donor programmes. Capacity building of Schools Management Committees, Teachers Training, Schools Improvement Plans, Missing facilities, and Early Childhood Education are the main components.



Mother & Child Health Care

Increasing access to health services by supplementing the government efforts; Immunization and Polio Initiatives. Participation in projects for mother and child health care, reproductive health and family planning, medical camps, eye care initiatives etc;



Gender Leadership Training Workshops

GBTI is aware that its efforts and contributions to poverty reduction must be coupled with actions to eliminate gender inequalities to promote sustainable human development. It is a conscious effort to ensure that one's rights or opportunities do not depend on being male or female. Women empowerment, gender sensitization, and leadership training are conducted.



Digital Literacy for Rural Women

Internet Dost is a digital literacy program for women to educate and train rural women regarding the benefits of the Internet. Through this project, male members are sensitized to enable women to use cell phones and access the internet. Rural women are provided basic skills to use smartphones, access the internet and, digital literacy so that they may improve their lives through enhanced access to information.



Business Development Training

Business development training equips women with the skills, confidence, and resources to start and grow successful businesses. It covers finance, marketing, leadership, and networking, empowering women to overcome challenges, seize opportunities, and drive economic growth.



Career Counselling and Guidance Workshops

It is essential to inform young students about the strategy to develop the talents given by nature. In this regard, the students from childhood are given counselling so that they can choose the profession according to their choice and interest. GBTI organizes workshops for students and teachers in collaboration with District Education Department

Community Management Skill Training

The managerial training programme ensures the level of management skills required for the proper functioning of community organisations. These programmes are led by professionals who have knowledge of the fields, community issues, and training along with their respective qualifications.



Vocational Training

Vocational and technical training courses are being conducted for youth (women and men) to promote skills. It enhances the technical skills of community members and contributes to self-employment. community women members are given training on tailoring machine/hand embroidery, cushion making, bed sheet making, E-commerce, computer etc



Subject Specific Training

Subject-specific training courses are being conducted for women to promote skills. It enhances the skills of community members and contributes to self-employment. Under the "subject-specific training" component, community women members are being given training on several subjects to either income generation or reduce household expenses. It includes candle making, pickle making, detergent making, tie & dye and, dessert making etc.
